Stuart Townend's hymn, "How deep the Father's Love for Us," says that the Father's love is beyond all measure. Nevertheless, if we were to attempt to measure it, how would we go about doing that? We use a thermometer to gauge the temperature and a ruler to measure the height and width of an object. But how do we determine, to borrow Paul's words in Ephesians 3:18, what is the breadth and length and height and depth of the Father's love?

One instrument that we can use is the object of our love. Love for those who are good or who are like us is commendable, but it isn't extraordinary. So too is love for those who love us. Frankly, that is easy to do. As Jesus said, "For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same (Matt. 5:46-47)?"

Love shows its depth, not in loving those who deserve our love or in loving those who are easy to love, but in loving the unlovable, which is exactly who God loves. He loves the weak, the ungodly, sinners, and even his enemies (Rom. 5:6, 8, 10).

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Another instrument that we can use to plummet the depths of love is timing. Paul says in Romans 5, that God demonstrated or showed his love for us "while we were still sinners (vs. 8)," and "while we were enemies (vs. 10)." Dylann Roof is a mass murderer, who had gone to a Bible study at Emmanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in South Carolina where he shot and killed nine people in the hopes of igniting a race war. He is evil and has done unspeakable evil. For the sake of illustration, consider him as an unrepentant and unreformed criminal. He doesn't regret what he did. In fact, he would do it again if he could. He remains every bit the monster he was when he entered that church and killed nine people. By contrast, consider him as if he was someone who had been reformed and transformed. He is utterly broken over what he has done. He has apologized to the victims' families, even though he believes that he doesn't deserve to be forgiven. He is not the same person he was before. He is kind, considerate, helpful, and loving. Which person would be easier to love? Obviously, the one who had changed.

Slide & Audio: Weichang Yu God loved us while we were still sinners and his enemies, and not after we had waved the white flag or after we had reformed ourselves. He loved us while we hated him, while we were evil and doing evil, while we were shaking our fists at him. Moreover, God didn't love us because he could see down the corridor of time that we would change and stop hating him. He loved us while were still sinners and it is because he loved us that we have changed and have stopped hating him. "In this is love, not that we have loved God, but that he loved us (1 John 4:10)."

A third instrument is manner. Love can be measured by what a person is willing to do or give to their beloved. It is easy to say that you love someone, much harder to show it, and you show it by what you do, give, or sacrifice for the one you love. The greater the gift or sacrifice, the greater the love. How did God love us? What did he give or sacrifice for us? His one and only Son (John 3:16; 1John 4:9, 10; Rom. 8:32). He didn't sacrifice Abraham or David or an angel or some other created being. He gave his one and only Son. His Son who is righteous, holy, and good. His Son who is altogether lovely and lovable.

Consequently, the Father sent his Son, not to the garden of Eden, but to this present evil age, where he would suffer and die on a cross as a sacrifice for sins. This involved the Father handing his Son over to his enemies, including Satan, his archenemy. Jesus noted Satan's involvement in his death when he said to his disciples during his farewell discourse, "I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming (John 14:30)."

Satan didn't, however, work alone. In John 8 Jesus pointed out that the Jewish leaders were like the devil in that they too hated him and were trying to kill him. After many failed attempts, they were finally able to satisfy their thirst for his blood. This is why Jesus had said to them in the garden of Gethsemane, "But this is your hour, and the power of darkness (Luke 22:53)." Unsurprisingly, they took full advantage of the opportunity the Father gave them when he delivered Jesus into their hands. Psalm 22 paints the terrifying picture for us: "Many bulls encompass me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me; they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion. I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and

my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death. For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet--I can count all my bones-- they stare and gloat over me; they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots."

How the Father loved us in giving up his Son shows us how great his love is for us. As John Murray writes, "the Father gave over his own Son, who is perfectly good and pure, to the malignity and hate, power and ingenuity of the prince of darkness. And he did this for you while you were still his enemy. Does this not tell you that the Father loves you? Does this not prove to you the vastness of the Father's love for you?"

Still another instrument that measures love is the goal or purpose. The reason the Father gave his Son is so that we might not perish but have everlasting life. Or as 1 John 4:9 says, "God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him."

Paul says in Galatians that if the law could have given life, then Christ died in vain. To die in vain is to die for nothing. It would be like jumping into the lake and dying for your little brother when he isn't drowning. You may have the best intentions in jumping to your death and you may be eager to demonstrate your love by dying, but if what you do doesn't benefit your brother, then it isn't good or even loving. It is pointless. However, if your little brother is drowning and you give your life to save him, then that indeed is the height of love. The Father gave us his Son to redeem us. He met our greatest need with his greatest gift and thereby demonstrated the greatness of his love.

Although the Father's love for us is beyond all measure, we can capture a glimpse of its depth by considering who the Father loved, when the Father loved, how the Father loved and why the Father loved. In short, "How deep the Father's love for us, How vast beyond all measure, That he should give His only Son, To make a wretch His treasure."

Australian and World-wide Praise & Prayer

More Pastors to serve in the CRCA – Continue to remember South Barwon Reformed Church, Casey Reformed Church, Canberra Reformed Church, and other CRCA churches as they seek to call a pastor.

Synod 2024 – Our denominational Synod will be meeting in May this year, please pray for our churches and Classes as they consider the reports before Synod this year, and pray that wisdom and humility may prevail at Synod – to the glory of God! Please pray that our office bearers would be able to manage the extra workload required with properly examining all the synodical reports that are now before our churches. Give thanks to God for Oasis Church in Queensland who is extending hospitality to all our churches in hosting this year's Synod.

Victoria – pray for our state, our government, and for the protection and freedom of liberty that we may live quiet, godly lives, free to worship and share the gospel. Pray for the conversion of our elected representatives, and for revival in our city and state.

Religious Discrimination Bill – The Prime Minister has announced his intention to work with the Greens party to develop a Religious Discrimination Bill. 1. HARVEST THANKSGIVING

Please join in praise to God for the addition of 143 new believers who came to know about Christ last month.

2. NATIONAL ELECTIONS

Please pray for the general elections in India which will be held from 19th April to 1st June 2024. We request you to pray for a peaceful atmosphere during the election period and National leaders will be chosen who uphold the constitution that grants freedom of religion in India. The present ruling party is a militant Hindu party.

3. PERSECUTION

A ministry couple has asked for special prayer as in one of the outreach villages there continues to face opposition from the village leaders. The village leaders allow families to pray in their homes but do not allow house groups meeting for prayer. They may not gather together for worship events in that village.

4. MINISTRY TRAINING

From mid-April to early May another group of ministry workers will receive theological training. Three teachers are rolling out this ongoing program. Please remember that Jesus has never been proclaimed amongst these people. In the global West we have a rich Gospel heritage. Please also remember that most of these leaders are first generation believers and have had little formal education. May God bless the young and growing church amongst tribal people. May he enable these leaders to be equipped and strengthened in their understanding of the Gospel and teach the whole counsel of God.

5. BIBLE COLLEGE

Let us pray that God in his goodness and in his time will provide a Bible College for training many more tribal pastors to effectively reach the lost amongst our peoples. Fifteen million are yet to be reached, so there is a great need for well trained evangelists to proclaim Christ effectively.

Vanuatu-Give thanks to God for the completion of Bible translation projects into two Vanuatu languages, following linguistic, translation and literacy work by missionaries from the Presbyterian Reformed Church of Australia and the Reformed Churches of New Zealand, working with the Summer Institute of Linguistics (SIL), over more than 50 years. The portions of scripture published and used over the decades have been instrumental in many conversions to Christ and in establishing churches in those parts of Vanuatu. The whole Bible in the Big Nambas language, spoken by the people of NW Malekula, will be launched and dedicated at a service TODAY (31 March) and widely distributed among the Big Nambas people over the next week. A revised New Testament translation in the Lenakel language,

spoken on the island of Tanna, will be dedicated at a service on Friday 5 April. These translations will be used in gospel preaching and discipling on Malekula and Tanna, and in the capital, Port Vila, where many people from those language groups live. Give thanks for the completion of these translation and publishing works, and for those who have given many years of their lives to complete it. Pray for the Lord's blessing on the special events over the next few weeks, and that through them God's Word will reach many people and by used by Him to bring many more to a saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Pray for the Presbyterian Theological Seminary (PTS) in India - PTS in Dehradun has had their Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act (FCRA) license revoked. This means that they are now unable to receive any funding from overseas. Since PTS relies heavily on foreign donors this could potentially be devastating in terms of their ability to continue to operate.

Please pray for our brothers and sisters at PTS, especially that the reapplication process will be successful, and that they will somehow be able to continue with their vital gospel work in the meantime.
