https://rcbhpast or.substack.com/ In my youth as a Christian, I was raised and worshipped in a pentecostal church. I remember distinctly a time in my 20s when I sincerely yearned for sure and true guidance from God on something significant that was going on in my life. I found it to be a season of life in which I felt immense uncertainty, and at which I was greatly perplexed and disheartened. I was instructed to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and received at times what seemed to me fairly vague words of prophetic revelation concerning what I ought to do. Nevertheless, those words given by well meaning believers only ultimately fuelled my uncertainty, and did not offer any discernable direction to me.

For me, that season represents a pastoral touching point on this question of how the Holy Spirit guides us in our lives. No doubt you have had other experiences for yourself. Perhaps, like me, you had a season of life in the pentecostal church, and that raised questions for you. Perhaps you've been raised in a tradition that speaks little of experience when it comes to the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Christian. Maybe this area of life leaves you with a yearning, or desire for something that you don't understand, but nevertheless you do desire. You want to know the presence and power of the Holy Spirit in your life. Perhaps it's actually something you don't think about much at all.

I don't intend to say all that there is to be said on these questions in this short meditation, and I don't think that I could if I wanted to. But I do want us to consider, in a little, the connection between the Spirit and truth. I think that as we consider the relationship between truth and the Holy Spirit, we will find that scripture affords us a great deal of clarity and insight into how the Holy Spirit ministers in our lives. I suggest that the very first thing that we need to consider is a very special title that the Lord Jesus revealed to us concerning the Holy Spirit, being that he is the "Spirit of truth."

The Apostle John, in his gospel, especially highlights to us Jesus' teaching on the relationship between the Holy Spirit and truth. He does this by revealing to us, at God's behest, that the Holy Spirit is "the Spirit of Truth" (Jn 14:17; 15:26; 16:13). Let's consider each of these passages in turn.

Our first passage, John 14:17, shows us that the Spirit of truth communicates truth (Christ) to us. In John 14:16-17 we read: "...I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, (17) even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you." As Don Carson notes, Jesus' reference to the Holy Spirit as "the Spirit of truth" is made, primarily, because "he communicates truth" (Carson, John, ref:14:17).

Slides & Audio Lim Family Carson goes on to note that we should not neglect to interpret this verse in light of 14:6, where Jesus has already made reference to the truth: "Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." In other words, Jesus is saying that as the Holy Spirit communicates the truth to us, Jesus himself will be present (Mt 28:20b), and thus the encouragement of verse 18 on the heels of verses 17: "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you."

The second passage in which the Spirit is called "the Spirit of truth", John 15:26, reinforces and makes explicit Carson's point about the Spirit ministering to us the voice and presence of Christ. The verse itself reads as follows: "But when the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness about me." The Spirit, proceeding from the Father, reveals the Son, in accordance with the will of Father, and in the very centre here we find that glorious title of the Spirit, that he is "the Spirit of truth." In other words, and in summary, the Spirit of truth is the living voice of Christ in the midst of the Church, in accordance with the decree and authority of the Father, in whom and from whom exists and proceeds all truth.

Our final passage with reference to this divine title of the Holy Spirit is John 15:16: "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." In these words we find further confirmation of all points previously made (i.e. in 14:17 and 15:26), but with a more clear and specific reference to the continuous work of the Spirit in guiding us, his people, into all the truth. Here is a supreme comfort above all comforts. You and I may falter and fall, and our knowledge of the truth in this life is partial and incomplete. So too we may be discouraged by the inner workings of sinful unbelief in our hearts, and troubled and perplexed by errors we hold in ignorance. But beyond all such failing, failures, and sins, that Sovereign Sentinel of Truth, the Holy Spirit, infallibly and irresistibly guides his people safely into the harbour of salvation, and ever works unto our sanctification. And his work will be perfect and completely perfect when all is said and done. Rest in this, dear believer, when your own ignorance and folly threatens to destabilise you, rest in the eternal presence and work of God's Holy Spirit among us. He will guide us into all truth.

As a seal upon these three revelations of "the Spirit of truth", we find the Apostle once again showing us the connection between the Spirit and the truth. In 1 John 5:6, we find an equivocation so clear that it's glory begins to transcend us. As you may remember, scripture at times makes a seamless interchange between God himself and the concept of truth. So one of the Father's names is revealed to be "the God of truth" (Is 65:16), so the Son reveals himself to "the truth" (Jn 14:6); and so we read in 1 John 5:6 that the "the Spirit is the truth." I confess, I do not have all the answers when it comes to the ways and workings of the Holy Spirit among his people. But this I can say with confidence: the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of truth. Because of this, I know that his chief ministry is to reveal Christ, who is the truth, to us, and to guide us into all truth that we may more and more truly reflect Christ's image. Any doctrine of the Holy Spirit that does not hold these truths to be front and centre has missed the point. Christ is with us, and he speaks to us through his word, and by the power and presence of his Holy Spirit. SDG.

Indiway - Prayer Items for July

1. Our missionaries: praise God as they were able to share the good news to many. 77 people responded to the Gospel in June. Please pray that God in grace will work his life changing power in their lives and communities.

2. We thank God for Vacation Bible School program which was conducted in for over 300 children over two days. They were taught Bible stories, songs and games in 12 Christian teachers helped conduct the classes.

3. Please pray for a good monsoon season with adequate rain. Most of the people in our mission field are farmers and farm labourers. They depend on rainfall for good cultivation since agriculture is the main source of their livelihood.

4. Please pray for the Thanksgiving meetings which are going to be organised during the first week of July 2024 at three different locations The reason for these meeting is that we can look back on 18 years of God's faithfulness over the last 18 years. By God's grace thousands and thousands of people have responded to the Gospel and gathered into churches in the tribal belt. God has blessed the partnership in missions.

Prayer item from the IndiWay Committee.

5. Please also pray about financial situation. Humanly speaking IndiWay is facing shortfalls right now. For 18 years God has faithfully provided for our needs. We started then with just 10 missionaries. Today there are over 70 full time missionaries. The total budget is about the same as 2.5 full time ministers serving in Australia.

The IndiWay committee faces a serious shortfall in meeting our budget. We have never had to decrease our level of support for reaching these needy tribal people.

All our missionaries on the ground belong to the very tribe they are trying to reach. God is using them to effectively reach their own people.

 \cdot Western missionaries are not allowed to proclaim Christ in tribal villages.

• Western missionaries would never be able to relate to the suffering that comes from such poverty, discrimination, exploitation and rejection that tribal people face.

• Western missionaries would never become proficient with the language, traditions and culture of tribal people; neither would they understand the darkness and oppression of animism and Hinduism.

God is using us as partners to build his Kingdom.

a. Pray for more individual partners. Most partners do commit for a season. Some partners for a year or two. Some have retired and stepped back from support. Some are facing greater cost of living pressures. We need more individuals to take their place. Individual partners provide 75% of our funds.
b. Pray for generous congregational giving for this harvesting ministry in our congregations. Covid has significantly changed the giving patterns of our churches. Denominational support continues to decline.
